Name & address of space	Description and purposes	Quality of facility
Stoke Road Green, Stoke Road	Contains the Millennium Garden, has seating x3, a notice board and the village sign. Used by the village for various social event and used by local children for play.	The green is triangular in shape, has well maintained grass and garden. Is bordered on the West side by a footpath and high hedge, On the North side there is a roadway and on the South side there is a picket fence.
Men's Own Rugby Club, Stoke Road	The Rugby Club is privately owned but is used by villagers for many social events and sports training. The pitch is a large, well kept area with goals and there is a clubhouse and parking on the site.	Large rugby pitch on entrance to the village from the A508. Although there is a fair amount of parking on site, there are often cars parked along the verges and over the footpath.
Field on Stoke Road between 5 Stoke Road and Vale Farmhouse	An open field used for animal grazing.	The field has two separate owners being divided horizontally and is known as being an example of Ridge and Furrow ploughing.
St Michael and All Angels Church cemetery.	This is the burial ground of the village church	The Parish Council pays for the grass cutting and upkeep of the land while villagers care for plants and a wild garden in the East side of the land to the rear of the church.
Area of trees and wild grasses, Off Roade Hill on the right hand side of the bridleway just before the Railway bridge	This is a piece of land that has a selection of trees that shelter the village from the noise of the trains on the high embankment that borders it.	An open area in private ownership.
First Field on the right hand side of the Bridleway after the Railway bridge.	Field used for horse grazing	Field is fenced and has a purpose built horse stable, some hard standing.
Second Field on the right hand side of the Bridleway after the Railway bridge.	Used for animal grazing	Completely fenced piece of land
Two Fields along Hartwell Road	These fields belong to the village and are managed by the Charity Fields Committee for the Parish Council. They are rented out to a local farmer and the rent is used for charity purposes in the village.	Both fields are fenced in and gated. They are not joined as there is another field between them.

<p>The Recreation Ground, Off Hartwell Road, To the South of the Old Crown Pub Garden.</p>	<p>The Parish Council rents this land from Charles Wells Brewery for the use of the village as a recreation ground and also pay for grass cutting on the land. It currently has a 25 year lease.</p>	<p>The South edge of the field has a long building bordering half and a residential wooden fence bordering the rest. The Eastern edge is a high, unkempt hedge, the Northern edge has wooden fence and the Western edge has a house along it and fences to several properties. There are football goals, swings, slide and climbing frame on the land used by children and the local school uses it for sports activities. It is also used for village fetes and fundraising activities. There are picnic tables and seating put out in the summer months.</p>
